  - Revisiting the Seebohm Report (1968)
    - Local Authority Social Services Act (1970)
    - BASW (1970)
    - 1980s/1990s separation of services begins
    - 1997 'nothing works' CJ SW Ed ceased, a new Probation Training, SW need not apply
    - 1998 new language
    - Children Act 2004 disaggregation completed.
    - 2007 -

- Follow Sentencing Guidelines and Female Offender Strategy
- No pregnant women in prison
- No woman is difficult centre lived experience
- Common transdisciplinary social work education and CPD expectation
- Grasp the Nettle justice work is social work
- Recognise & Address the intersectionally gendered, racialised and classist experience of justice and children's social work
- Reframe adult and child social work around family and community
- Pre-birth protocol as practice
- MoJ to include post-sentence in priorities moving on.
